Vet Attestation - Requirement for livestock entering the food chain which may be exported to the European Union (EU)

To Livestock Producers,

If you are not part of a qualifying assurance scheme and have not yet received a vet visit and Vet Attestation Number (VAN), very shortly your business will be impacted if your livestock or any part of animal products derived from your livestock enters the food chain and may be exported to the EU.

Exports to the European Union (EU) will be stopped for livestock, livestock products and some 5th quarter products, from livestock farmers who do not provide a Vet Attestation Number (VAN) or show that they are part of a qualifying farm assurance scheme. ACT NOW. If you do nothing and do not have a VAN, it may limit the value and demand for your livestock.

If you are not part of a qualifying assurance scheme and have not already received a vet visit and VAN, you should follow the steps below, or you may limit the value and demand for your livestock at a market or abattoir in the near future.

Speak to your vet to either;

a) **request a backdated vet attestation and VAN** from a farm visit in the last 12 months, or b) **arrange a visit from your vet** to provide you with a Vet Attestation and VAN. The visit does not have to have been specifically to provide a VAN – it can be provided during vet visits carried out for other purposes, as long as the criteria at question 10 in the Defra Q&A are covered which can be found at https://ahdb.org.uk/exports.

Familiarise yourself with changes that have been made to forms, systems and processes and include your VAN. This includes updated **LIS-Movement forms** (Sheep, Goats and Deer), and new functionalities within the **LIS** (Sheep, England), **eAML2** (Pig, England & Wales) and **Scot EID** (cattle, sheep and pigs, Scotland) digital movement systems.

Ask your livestock markets and/or abattoir where and how you can provide your VAN to them.

Read the Vet Attestation information here - https://ahdb.org.uk/exports DO NOT DO NOTHING.

If you do not act on this, your animal products will, very shortly, not be able to be exported to the EU.

During the implementation period, farmer self-declarations are still being accepted. However, the implementation period will end on the 12th of April 2024 and from 13th April 2024, if there is no VAN or other evidence that a farm visit has been carried out (Farm Assurance), animal carcasses, or parts of the animal carcass, will not be eligible for export to the EU Please note: If you would like to receive your market payments via BACS online transfer, please call our accounts department on **01872-272722** & ask for Sophie. We will require, **your account number & sort code.** Market payments will reach your account the following Wednesday.

A topping entry of Prime Cattle to report seeing a much higher level of overall quality than has been consigned in recent weeks, with prices and keenness of bidding responding accordingly. Top of the day was a cracking **663kg** Limousin steer from Mr W J P Julian of Summercourt sitting pretty at **299p/kg**, which was closely followed by a very good Limousin heifer in from Messrs W S Gay & Son of St Allen at **297p/kg**. Next in the steers was a **655kg** Limousin from Mrs J Julian of Summercourt trading at **295p/kg** and a lighter **607kg** Limousin steer from Messrs J & J Sawle & Son of St Agnes realised **293p/kg** thereafter. Another Limousin steer from Mr Julian traded for **290p/kg**, which was followed by a run of four more brilliant Limousin steers from Messrs Sawle with three all tied at **286p/kg** and another at **284p/kg**. Many prime bullocks looked very well sold above **240p/kg** which are too numerous to mention, but are all a credit to their Vendors. The Truro liveweight trade continues to buck the trend of deadweight prices so consign now to capitalise on this!

A very good entry in the cull section this week, with trade definitely on the rise and numbers forward following suit. A joint top price in the beef types was awarded to a Limousin cow from Mr A S Ball of Bodmin and a Charolais cow from Mr K R Williams of Tehidy both at **225p/kg.** A Limousin cow from Mr R J Trezise of Morvah went under the hammer from **218p/kg** which was again tied with a Limousin cow from Osborne Brothers of St Just at the same money.
